## **Health Checks**

- Upon arriving to St Peter's all volunteers and participants will have their temperature taken and checked for COVID symptoms.
- We encourage parents to also conduct a daily health check before sending their children to St Peter's.
- We will be checking for the following symptoms:
  - o Fever (100.4 or higher) or chills
  - Cough
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Fatigue
  - Muscle or body aches
  - Headache
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Sore throat
  - Congestion or runny nose
  - Nausea or vomiting
  - o Diarrhea
- We will also be asking if there has been any contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID in the past 14 days.
- Based on the symptoms present and specific circumstances, a student or volunteer who
  is believed to be at risk of having COVID will be asked to return home.

## **Face Coverings/Masks**

The importance of wearing face coverings has been well documented and is being recommended by public health officials at all levels. Face coverings may slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others. Face coverings, as used in this plan, mean a uniform piece of material that covers a person's nose and mouth and remains affixed in place without the use of one's hands, whether storebought or homemade, concurrent with Nassau County Health Department guidelines.

Parents are encouraged to provide their students with their own face coverings. However, the church will provide face coverings for students who do not have them.

• Students and volunteers are required to wear masks when they arrive to St Peter's and upon entering any buildings.

- Masks must continue to be worn while moving into and through spaces, and only removed once seated at a work area socially distant from others.
- If and student moves from their work area they must put their mask on prior to.
- If a student needs assistance from the volunteer monitor and one or both persons must move from their seated location, both parties are required to put on their masks

## **Hygiene and Workstations**

Tables and chairs to be used as workstations will be spaced out appropriately in order to maintain safe distance while inside the church buildings. Students may not share work areas that require them to be within a 6ft of one another, unless they live within the same household.

Good hand hygiene will play an important role in our ability to prevent the spread of the virus. The importance of washing hands frequently and using hand sanitizer will be emphasized on an ongoing basis. Hand sanitizer will be available in all spaces.

High touch surfaces in buildings and restrooms will be cleaned, sanitized, and disinfected each day and between programs.
